GLOBAL	Description of action: Take part in world food day (october) Faith Input: This will coincide with Harvest festival. There will be a mass for Harvest led by the children who are helping us strive towards the live simply award. The food collected for Harvest will go to a local food bank. Education input: Assembly from Headteacher Wecould look at ensuring there is food tech being taught in DT and Geography.	Description of action: Whole school sponsored walk to raise money for Cafod. We will invite local parish priest and parents to participate Faith Input: Collective worship about CAFOD helping others- Bible references- The good samaritan etc. We will also learn the Live simply prayers Education input: We will talk about the benefits of the exercise we are doing and in Geography map out our walking route.	Description of action: Host a month of remerance in November thinking in particular about those who have died or suffered or continue to suffer as consequence of war. We will sell poppies in school to raise funds for the British Legion. Faith Input: Rememberance mass. Rememerance collective worship in class. Education input: Links to history. Each class to have a rememberance related text for writing or class reading.
LOCAL	Description of action: Create a link with a local care home. Children to write letters. School choir to visit at Christmas for songs and hymns. Faith Input: Coming together with our local community to share and celebrate the story of Christ's birth. Education input: Link to music- After school choir club participation.	Description of action: Working with our local Family suport centre we will raise money for a particular area of need they have. This could be done through a non-uniform day. Faith Input: Collective worship/ assembly about why we are supporting them, discuss being a Christian about looking beyond our own needs Education input: Understanding of local area. We could invite our local MP/ councillor to discuss our local area and take questions from the children.	Description of action: Mini-vinnies scheme set up again in school. Along with lead teacher fundraise for the SVP society. Faith Input: Invite SVP into school for an assembly Education input: learn about Saint vincent De Paul in RE. consider how we can be like him and what virtues he can teach us.
SCHOOL	Description of action: Working along side our after school ECO club we will enhance our outdoor spaces to enable prayer to place. Faith Input: Outdoor collective worship Education input: Learning about nature in our own setting. Bringing nature and outdoor space into our collective worship. Children will learn about how God creatin can help us pray.	Description of action: Inspired by Laudato SI, we will use an assembly to launch the scheme across the school. There will be a display in school about reuse, reduce and recycling. ECO club will collect paper each week to recycle and award points to classrooms for being economical with their electricty ie switching the lights and board off when not in the room. Faith Input: Assembly- Laudato Si Education input: Children could learn the Laudato Si hymn.	Description of action: Each class to create a live simply pledge. Faith Input: These pledges displayed in class on prayer focus to remind children as they say their daily prayers. Education input: Children will be learning abouttheir responsibility in caring for our God given planet.

LiveSimply

Criteria for live simply: To take action towards living a simpler lifestyle including slowing down and finding time to pray and reflect, refusing and reducing on what we consume, spending more time on the simpler things in life including reflective time with family and friends, time in nature.

Brief description of main action: Take part in world food day (October) to coincide with Harvest festival.

How will you plan for a wider community engagement?

We will contact the Local food bank, discuss what they need the most and ask for donations through a newsletter.
